### **Market access in life sciences: orphan drugs**

In recent years, the treatment of rare diseases has progressed due to an increasing number of new drugs. However, the mounting expenditure is a key concern that came along. The legal and regulatory framework help explaining the fast pace on orphan drugs approval in some jurisdictions, while patient advocacy, market access initiatives, clinical trials, HTA's models are also important drivers to explain such trend. Conversely, risk sharing agreements, pricing and reimbursement regulation and public expenditure legislation are key tools to seek a balance between the demand and the challenge of funding. The panel will discuss the singularities of the orphan drug niche, how it has progressed from the first initiatives in the early '80s, where it is today and what may be the future legal, regulatory and economic barriers in different jurisdictions, such as US, Europe and Latin America.
